Course Name: Second Grade Social Studies

Course Description:

The second grade Social Studies curriculum begins with a study of groups: communities, cities, suburbs, and rural areas. Geography skills are built upon with a study of maps and globe reading skills. A study of economics and graphing skills are taught with emphasis on needs/wants, work, goods/services, money, field/market, and trade among nations. Immigration and the cultures of other countries are also introduced at this time. The first Americans are explored with an emphasis on Jamestown/Plymouth, new colonies, past heroes, and communication changes. The areas of our democratic government are also taught with importance placed on citizenship skills, laws, and leadership. State capitals are also identified.

Content:

Characteristics of different types of communities
Understanding of simple economics and how it affects people
Learn about the way people in communities use resources
Explore the oldest U.S. communities of the Native Americans
Learn the history of first American explorers and the communities they established
Gain an understanding of the process of immigration to the United States
Be aware of current events in our nation and world
Gain an understanding of democratic government
