Department: World Languages

Course Name: French II

Course Description:

This course is designed for students of the second year of Upper School French. It requires a review of grammar and vocabulary of the first year of the language, and it is an introduction of more complicated, intermediate structures that will enhance an overall study of the target language at this level. The students will begin to write formal prose in French, based on a given unit or theme, as well as learn to speak more in the target language in the daily class exercises. The main emphasis of the course is to develop greater ease of self-expression in the language. Pre-requisite: A minimum final grade of 75% in French I and/or departmental approval.
