Department: World Languages **Course Name:** Honors French IV

Course Description:

This course is designed for students of the fourth year of Upper School French. It is a course that continues with a review of grammar and vocabulary from the third-year course, and it introduces more complex structures and technical vocabulary. The students will continue to employ the three modes of communication---interpersonal, interpretive and presentational---as defined in the 21st Century Standards of World Languages as they apply to the "5 C's:" 1) Communication, 2) Community, 3) Comparison, 4) Connections, and 5) Culture. The students study the following themes: generational movement, scientific research and progress, leisure activities, the workplace, and natural resources. The course is taught in accordance with ACTFL's proficiency guidelines, with the focus on the francophone world. As well as regular assignments in the text, the students are exposed to longer, more challenging reading assignments in selections of authentic literature, magazine articles, videos on different aspects of francophone culture and history, short stories, etc. In this way, the students can learn more quickly and build a mastery of active, appropriate vocabulary based on context. Prerequisite: A minimum final grade of 83% in French III and/or departmental approval.
