Department: Performing Arts

Course Name: Upper School Chorus

Course Description:

This class is open to students in grades 9-12 and may meet with the 8th grade students enrolled in MS Chorus. It is designed to expand upon the fundamentals of individual and choral singing such as tone production, intonation, diction, interpretation, and balance in choral settings. A variety of genres and performance styles will be explored. Students will learn how to evaluate music for possible performance and select repertoire for performance under the instructor's supervision. Group performances as well as extra rehearsals outside of the class schedule are required. Students are encouraged but not required to enter district, state or national competitions and auditions.

There is a \$60 fee to cover the repertoire selected by the instructor. Students may need to purchase personal items to complete the Concert Black Attire for the Winter and Spring Concert. There may be additional performance opportunities or enrichment opportunities and field trips. These may have an additional cost or may be covered by the fee above.
