Course Name: Photography 1- Developing a Visual Narrative

Course Description:

This semester-long course is open to students in grades nine through twelve and introduces students to photography as both a traditional and contemporary art form. Students will develop a foundational understanding of how cameras function, including exposure, focus, composition, lighting, and visual narrative, while sourcing and creating their own photographic imagery.

Building upon these traditional foundations, students will explore how photography has expanded within contemporary art and visual culture through digital editing, image manipulation, and time-based media. Using industry-standard digital tools such as Adobe Photoshop, as well as introductory practices in film and animation, students will investigate how images can be altered, sequenced, and combined to communicate conceptual ideas.

Throughout the course, students will engage in project-based learning that emphasizes experimentation, creative problem-solving, and intentional decision-making. Class discussions, written reflection, and critique will support students in developing visual literacy and artistic voice. This course prepares students for advanced studio art coursework and encourages critical engagement with the image-saturated world they navigate daily. Prerequisite: Foundations

Methods of Instruction:

Demonstration of projects broken down into sequential steps
Guided dialogue accompanied by visuals
Guided practice and individual instruction
Guided interactive instruction using digital applications like Padlet, Nearpod and Flipgrid
Collaborative class critique

Grading contracts that include investment, accountability, and participation
Resolution of assignments that reflect assignments' expectations
Collaborative class critique
