Course Description:

During this year-long course, for 8th grade and above when there is sufficient enrollment, students acquire basic vocabulary and grammatical structures. The focus in class will be on real life language use, the integration of culture and language through exploration of the francophone world, and the four skills of reading, listening, writing, and speaking.
